

Constitution

Article I.

Section 1. NAME: This organization shall be known as Association of Structural Pest Control Regulatory Officials.

Section 2. MEMBERS: This association shall be composed of the Chief Structural Pest Control Regulatory Official or equivalent official, or his designee of any of the fifty states.

Article II.

Section 1. PURPOSE: The purpose of this organization shall be to promote better understanding and efficiency in the administration of laws and other written documents of regulatory authority between states concerning the control and eradication of pests of structures and their immediate environs. To promote the protection of the health and welfare of the citizens of each state, to promote the protection of the environment against misuse of pesticides, to promote a more professional standard for the structural pest control industry and to promote, conduct, and evaluate research consistent with the purpose's stated herein.

Article III.

Section 1. VOTING: In the transaction of ASPCRO official business, each member state shall be entitled to one vote which is to be cast by the Chief Structural Pest Control regulatory official or equivalent, or his or her authorized representative from his or her own state.

Section 2. QUORUM: A quorum shall consist of a number of members representing a majority of the member states in good standing at the annual meeting or a special meeting.

Section 3. CONDUCT OF MEETINGS: All meetings of the ASPCRO shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's "Rules of Order" except when there is a conflict with this constitution and by-laws in which case the constitution and by-laws shall prevail.

Article IV.

Section 1. OFFICERS: The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer, to be elected bi-annually. Officers are eligible to re-election.

Section 2. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: The executive committee of this organization shall consist of the officers of said organization, the immediate past president and a board of three members to be elected by the membership at large. Committee members shall serve a two year term.

Article V.

Section 1. AMENDMENTS: The constitution may be amended at any meeting by a three-fourths vote of the members in good standing, provided those present constitute a quorum at that meeting and providing the proposed amendment or amendments have been submitted to each member in good standing thirty (30) days before the meeting.
